

Avilamycin Medicated Broiler Chicken Feed (avilamycin Type C medicated feed)

CAUTION: Federal law restricts medicated feed containing this veterinary feed directive (VFD) drug to use by or on the order of a licensed veterinarian.

INDICATION

For the prevention of mortality caused by necrotic enteritis associated with *Clostridium perfringens* in broiler chickens.

ACTIVE DRUG INGREDIENT

Avilamycin^a 13.6 to 40.9 g/ton*

INGREDIENTS

Each ingredient must be named in accordance with the names and definitions adopted by the Association of American Feed Control Officials.

FEEDING DIRECTIONS

Feed as the sole ration for 21 consecutive days. Feed to chickens that are at risk of developing, but not yet showing clinical signs of, necrotic enteritis associated with *Clostridium perfringens* in broiler chickens.

CAUTION

To assure responsible antimicrobial drug use in broiler chickens, treatment administration must begin on or before 10 days of age.

The safety of avilamycin has not been established in chickens intended for breeding purposes.

Avilamycin has not been demonstrated to be effective in broiler chickens showing clinical signs of necrotic enteritis prior to the start of medication.

The Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD) expiration date must not exceed 90 days from the VFD issuance date. VFDs for avilamycin shall not be refilled.
